Home learning grids	When we start our phonics sessions the children will bring home some handwriting sheets, and suggestions of activities that you can do at home to support their learning. The children will also be able to choose a book on a Friday to take home and return the following week.		
How to help your child	Read to your children as much as you can, such as a bedtime story. Talk to your children and ask them questions as you read together. Questions such as: What was your favourite part of the story? Do you know what might happen next? What is happening in the picture? Could there have been a different ending? Most importantly enjoy the time you have together exploring new stories. Allow your child to get dressed themselves or practise getting dressed by themselves. Putting their coats on and shoes. Ensure your child is aware of hand washing and regularly washing hands before food and after using the toilet. Help them to become independent with the use of the toilet, putting on own coat and wiping their own noses. Help them to recognise their own name. Count objects randomly and use number names in play, such as counting out their snack or how many toys they are tidying up. Count how many dolls they have or dinosaurs etc. Knowing their house door number is a good start.
